What is Ivy Plus Libraries?

Ivy Plus Libraries is a partnership between thirteen *leading academic research libraries* – Brown University, the University of Chicago, Columbia University, Dartmouth College, Duke University, Harvard University, Johns Hopkins University, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the University of Pennsylvania, Princeton University, Stanford University, and Yale University – *that* collectively provide access to a rich and unique record of human thought and creativity through resource sharing and collaboration.

The Ivy Plus Web Collecting Program is a collaborative collection development effort to build curated thematic collections of freely available, but at risk web content in order to support research at participating Libraries and beyond.

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

5	Campaign websites for state and local candidates running for office. These websites are time sensitive and prone to disappearing after an election. They offer unique insight into how specific communities relate to broader social and economic issues. 	Collecting at risk web based geoscience field trip guidebooks (many of them can be very ephemeral and only available for a short period of time around the date the field trip was offered).	Geoscience Field trip guidbooks are indexed by GeoRef and are an important source of local Geologic information that is often not found elsewhere.						
•	Documenting websites by/of/for Indigenous peoples of the U. S. and Canada, such as official tribal websites, indigenous museum websites, language reclamation projects, Native literature collectives and related sites that document the cultural experiences and diversity of Native North American Indigenous peoples.	As far as I can tell, there are a few web indexes to these sites, such as the National Congress of American Indians (http://www.ncai.org/). But no one seems to be capturing how Native peoples are using the web to express their cultural identities and share information about their issues, concerns and projects. Because of cultural sensitivities involving elite institutions doing this work, we would obviously want to ask permission to capture these sites before we do it. But if Indigenous peoples are interested in working with us, this could be a good adjunct to Yale's Indian Papers Project (https://yipp.yale.edu/), which captures historical records.						
	Collect individual country statistical agency web sites that provide valuable summary population data, such as census results, migration figures, and vital statistics. Often, the sites also include figures about the labor force, housing, agriculture, infrastructure, and economics (such as GDP, trade data, etc.) as well. Typically, there is one statistical agency in each country (about 200) that provides access to the majority of statistics about that country. In the past, these agencies produced print publications that were available for purchase and collected by research libraries. For many countries, this is no longer the case as they are increasingly providing this information on the web in the form of interactive sites, excel spreadsheets or PDFs of one or two pages, or links to numerous reports that are too labor intensive to collect systematically. These web pages contain valuable information that is used by library patrons in a multitude of disciplines. 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
